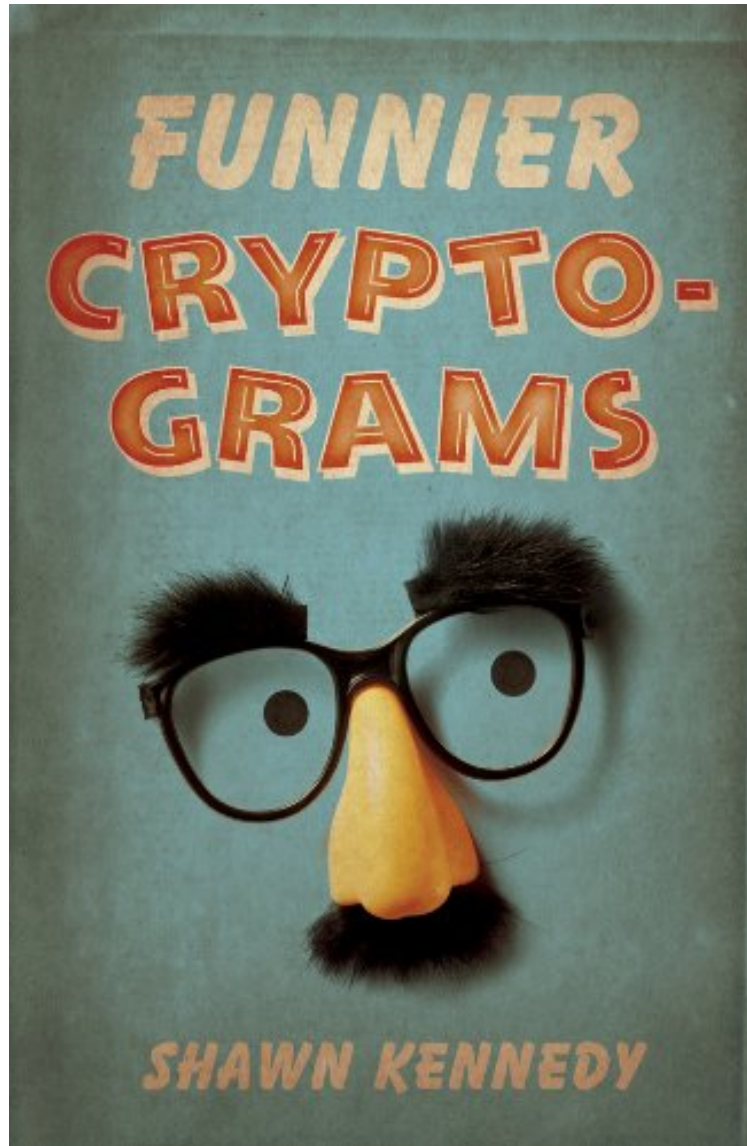

I like the book's hints for doing cryptograms in the beginning, and I generally use the letter clue for each cryptogram given at the end. The key is arranged so that one can look at just a few words to get a larger hint if necessary. 6 of 6 people found the following review helpful.
