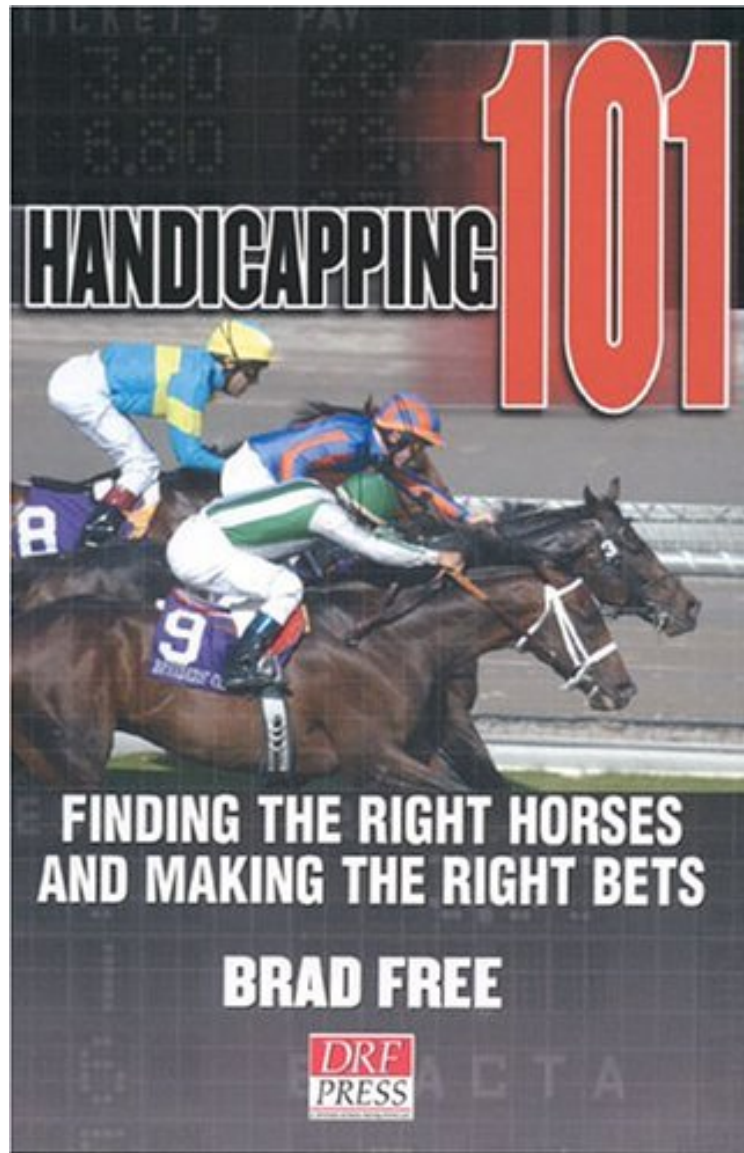

The only negative comment that I have on this book is that the author, like many other US horse handicappers, believes that turf racing does not favor early speed and biases more towards stretch runners. This is not true in Hong Kong and in any other places where turf racing instead of dirt racing is the main stream of horse racing.
