Here's a thoroughly practical book that provides concrete examples of how to put into practice modern theories of handicapping. Using examples of actual races, Dr. Quirin shows how to analyze forty-one different situations that may arise due to the race conditions, the track surface, or the horse itself. In each chapter, races have been carefully chosen not only to illustrate a major theme but also to provide several additional handicapping hints. Included are first-time starters, maiden races, two-year-olds, state-bred races, starter handicaps, restricted and classified allowance races, races at seven furlongs, races on soft grass, races taken off the grass, races in slop, European form, and many other topics for beginners and experienced handicappers alike. There is also an appendix of grass-breeding statistics. William L. Quirin earned his Ph.D. in mathematics at Rutgers University and at the time of publication was professor of mathematics and computer science at Adelphi University. His previous books are *Winning at the Races: Computer Discoveries in Thoroughbred Handicapping*, and *Thoroughbred Handicapping: State of the Art*, both published by William Morrow. He lives in Garden City, New York.

Thoroughbred Handicapping) with this collection of 41 examples illustrating how the previous books' theories can be applied. Unlike other "system" promoters, Quirin discusses numerous and varied factors that can affect the outcome of a horse race: so many, in fact, that the weekend or casual fan will become lost amid the complex manipulations required to select a bettable horse. This book must be studied, not just read, in conjunction with his other books by the serious bettor. Recommended for libraries with at least one of the earlier titles.
