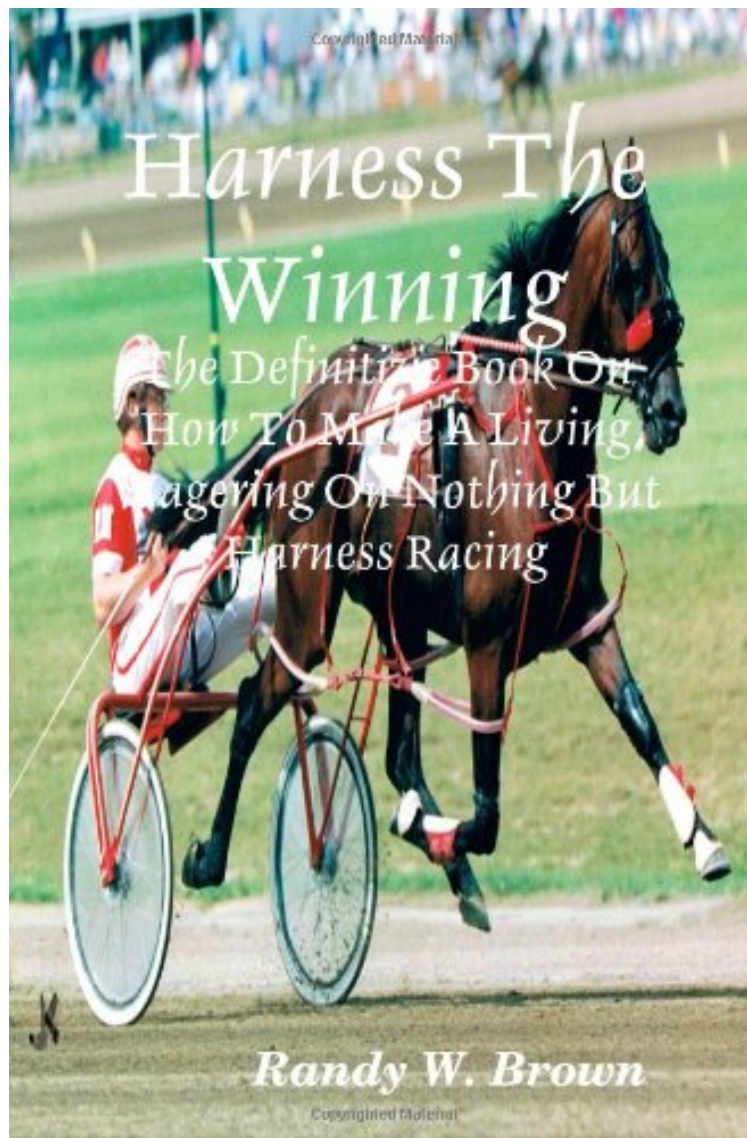

Mr Brown's book repeats itself verbatim several times over. As I was reading the various chapters I thought to myself: "didn't I just read this exact chapter? This happens repeatedly through the book which is divided into two segments. The second segment simply repeats the first. I think the author uses this book to encourage off track betting on his favorite site, and repeatedly offers you to use his personal referral number so that he can receive a bonus for the referral. He also encourages a visit to his handicapping web site. There are some good pointers, but they are never offered in a clear understandable fashion with any detail. About 20% of this book tells of recollected moments in his career of good or bad days wagering. This info did not enlighten me much, and I found it to be just another way of filling the pages. In my humble opinion this book is not worth the time or money. The \$27+ cost of this book is categorically "a bad bet". Sorry Mr. Brown, I gave it a try.
